Forced labour and labour trafficking are hidden crimes undertaken by exploitative employers, intermediaries and criminal gangs. Many businesses are not equipped to tackle these risks. Supply chain risks are characterised by groups vulnerable to labour exploitation including migrant workers undertaking unskilled or irregular work; young people and unskilled or illiterate workers and displaced people and by the use of third-party labour providers for recruitment and employment. Effective strategies to tackle the risk of forced labour require: a good understanding of where risks lie in the supply chain; an action plan to tackle those risks, remediation policies and effective monitoring and reporting.

Developed and delivered by labour rights experts from the retail sector this one-day participatory course will ensure you are informed and equipped to address forced labour in your supply chains, implement good practice and minimise the risk to your business.

- + Know what forced labour and hidden labour exploitation are
- + Understand how and where forced labour occurs in supply chains, the potential risks and impacts of this to your business, and the business case for tackling it

- + Be confident in your next steps to address forced labour in your business's supply chains and have the tools you need to implement what you've learnt.
